## APPLICATION FOR INSTITUTE-OWNED STUDENT HOUSING

Dear Incoming Student:

Congratulations on your acceptance to The Culinary Institute of America at Greystone. Our staff looks forward to welcoming you to your new “home”. Enclosed you will find an application for Institute-Owned Housing and a Residence Hall Agreement. In order to reserve a room, please complete the forms, sign where indicated and mail to The Culinary Institute of America at Greystone, attn: Program Coordinator, 2555 Main Street, St. Helena, California 94574 OR fax to (707) 967-2410. To be considered for on-campus housing, we must receive these materials by no later than 6 weeks prior to your start date. Priority will be given to graduates of the Institute’s degree programs.

### Vineyard Lodge

In 2005, The Culinary Institute of America completed renovations on a student housing center located on Pratt Avenue approximately 1 ½ miles from the Greystone campus in St. Helena, CA. This secured building includes 41 single- and double-occupancy rooms with private baths, common area, community kitchen and outdoor patio overlooking the vineyards of the Napa Valley. While the majority of residents will be long-term students in certificate programs, the facility may also serve the week-long short-term housing needs of other CE students, and therefore the space may be shared with other culinary professionals and not exclusively considered a dorm.

### Amenities

- Non-smoking, furnished room with bedspread, blanket, bed linens (sheets) and clean towels provided by housekeeping on a weekly basis.
- One additional meal per instructional day provided in the Teaching Kitchens.
- Utilities: Gas / electricity, water, heat, air-conditioning
- One secured television per room with cable service
- Local phone service
- Computer and internet connection per room
- Use of community kitchen with shared refrigeration, freezer and cabinet space.
- Furnished common area with plasma television and cable service
- Secured building
- Coin-operated laundry facility
- Regularly scheduled shuttle service to and from campus

### What to Bring

Personal toiletries and laundry soaps. Electrical equipment for personal hygiene (shaver, curling iron), and if desired, a personal-sized refrigerator (no larger than 4.3 cubic feet) will be allowed.

### What NOT to Bring (Prohibited Items)

Pets, electric/gas cooking equipment, furniture, drums or other musical instruments, electric blanket, and portable heaters. This is not an exhaustive list.

### Cost

\$3,125 per semester for single occupancy, based on a two-semester contract plus 12% transient occupancy tax. Total on-campus housing cost for 2 semesters is \$7,000 (including tax). Prices subject to increase July 1, 2007.
